

Below is the text of the Ethics Disclosure Form that the nominee will be required to fill out as part of the AAS prize and award nomination process. Note that there is no need to download or print this form here; it will appear in the prize nomination platform during the nomination process.

The Board of Trustees believes that it is important that all individuals honored by the Society exhibit the highest level of professionalism in our discipline, including abiding by the Society's Code of Ethics and related policies. We therefore require that anyone under consideration for an honor from the Society, nominees for office, or those seeking to serve in an appointed volunteer role disclose any past allegations or institutional proceedings resulting in a finding of professional misconduct, or any current formal complaints related to the candidate's professional conduct, even if the matter is still pending.

As some issues may require clarification as to whether additional investigation is required, the AAS President and AAS Code of Ethics Chair will determine if they have any conflict of interest and then an unconflicted person from those two will first hold a confidential phone call with anyone who feels they may need to disclose something. They will then decide if further disclosure and investigation is required, at which point you may be asked to provide additional details.
